The Ozark Bank has agreed to extend the note to December 15, 2015. The interest amount was \$2,042.00 and the Treasurer said it has been paid to Ozark Bank.

Presiding Commissioner Ray Weter said Blevins would like to wait until spring to make sure the asphalt cures completely. Commissioner Weter said the over lying issue is that we eliminated some providers due to the two coats of asphalt specification.

- * When is payroll run

- * Road will not be closed but will have a detour.
- * All change orders have to be signed by all parties.
- * Project is required to be completed within 21 days or pay liquid damages.
- * The contract needs signatures of all three Commissioners.
- * A survey must be run.

Rachel Smith, Owner A.T. Urban Development said they plan to start the project next week and it should be completed in 21 calendar days.

Steve Brown said all change orders have to signed by all parties. Mr. Brown said they have a change order to expand the ride fro 15 to 20 feet wide.

The contracts were signed by the Commissioners and attested by the County Clerk.

Steve Brown said there was an Addendum to the change order for the width of the bridge to increase from 15 to 20 feet would be approximately \$ 8,721.00.

The meeting was attended by Citizens Task Force Members: Judy Dollarhite, Lynn Kempen, Doug Twigger, Brad Erwin and Jeremy Younglove from Paragon Architecture,

Andrew Pitt from Treanor Architects and Amelia Wigton reporter for the Christian County Headliner News.

Brad Erwin said there were several alternatives to anticipate for the remodel of the existing court room that would affect the other offices that are on the second floor. There should be space allocated for jury rooms, lawyer client rooms, and the judge's office and office space for his clerk. In addition, the Auditor and Treasurer would be relocated to the break room or another area.

Brad Erwin discussed the option of converting the Prosecutor's office into a court room and having a stand alone office for the Prosecutor close to the Justice Center for the Prosecutor designed and constructed to be the cornerstone for a larger complex.

Brad Erwin if we look at this building there are many elements to consider such as security and the process and how the parts and pieces can be moved and how it sets the future growth.

Ray Weter said in the Justice Center there are no Attorney/Client consultation rooms and there are sewer back up problems that have existed since the beginning.

Brad Erwin said a view scope must be used to determine the condition of the existing sewer pipe to know what is needed to fix it.

Commissioner Weter said the ability to do this project when there is such a short timeline to complete will be a challenge.

Brad Erwin said to build a structure in 15 months for the Prosecutor would be tight on time but it can be done with hopes that House Bill 799 will be passed out of the veto session. In the short term everyone would have to relocate until we can build additional space.

Brad Erwin said he spoke with Judge Johnson and she said the jury box needs to be addressed and an overall renovation of the court room.

Brad Erwin said they will give a flat fee for their services up front after everything is determined. Brad said the timeline and the scope of the project is a moving target.

Commissioner Childers said the Citizens Task Force had interest in the FASCO building but she thought that it would be better suited as a manufacturing plant and the Prosecutor does not want to relocate to that building.

Mr. Erwin said the information from four years ago will give a very good baseline and when we meet with department heads to affirm with them and what the task force has found it should give them a lot of good points and costs and a long term solution.

Commissioner Weter said there is money available to purchase the two additional parcels but don't want to purchase additional properties without a plan for future growth.

Brad said the two streets in consideration are not used for utilities other than to the Lots themselves.

Commissioner Weter said the first thing is to have an agreement prepared and we can consider that and once we review that and sign on it and then you can begin looking at all the options and prepare a plan.

Commissioner Childers said we could conduct a study of the FASCO building to determine the feasibility of acquiring and remodeling the structure.

Commissioner Weter said we would like to know a preliminary cost to renovate the FASCO but we could spend months doing a preliminary study of FASCO with a limited amount of time.

Brad Erwin said the estimates 4-6 week to do a feasibility of all the different components.

Judy Dollarhite suggested that Brad Erwin meet with the citizens task force.

Commissioner Weter suggested getting the sketch that was done by the task force.

Brad Erwin said that will provide a scope, dollars, and time line.

Andrew Pitt previously there was discussion of transporting defendants to trial to this building by placing a sky walk between the two buildings and that would be very expensive. Mr. Pitt said you will have to decide what types of trials can be hold in the historic court room.

Judy Dollarhite said if you relocate the Auditor and the Treasurer to the break room where will the Veterans room be located. She said she thought the county was required to have a room for the Veterans per state statutes.

Presiding Commissioner Ray Weter entertained a motion to proceed to get a proposal from Paragon Archectiture.






