Discussion - Tax Revenue

The meeting was attended by Assistant Nikki Thiessen, Assistant Ashley Hannah, Judy Dollarhite, Executive Assistant Julia Maples, Dwight McNiel, David Widner, Amber Duran, County Treasurer Karen Matthews, County Auditor Lacey Hart, Eric Peterson, Jack Bologna.

Presiding Commissioner Weter said the Commisson received a request from citizen Dwight McNiel to address the budget and collected sales tax. The floor was opened to Dwight McNiel.

Mr. McNiel inquired as to why funds from collected sales tax and allowed for law enforcement use have not been released to supplement the Sheriff and County Prosecutor's office. He asked County Commission to take action in distributing the funds to those departments.

Presiding Commissioner Weter clarified with Mr. McNiel that the tax to which he's referring is the supplement from the Building Bond tax. Mr. McNiel agreed, and asked if Commission was aware of other funds allotted for law enforcement use that have not been released.

Discussion held. Auditor Lacey Hart and Treasurer Karen Matthews took the floor to address Mr. McNiel's inquiry and explain the County's accounting of sales tax.

Eric Peterson and asked for clarification from Ms. Matthews and Ms. Hart regarding the process of collecting sales tax and the transfer process. Discussion followed.

Mr. Peterson asked the Commission to get white board to create a flow chart so the public has visual during discussions regarding budgets to help clarify where funds currently are and where they are proposed to be transferred. He suggested that it would prevent confusion and keep people on task during Commission meetings.

Presiding Commissioner Weter explained that a white board has been used many times previously with little success.

Ms. Maples asked the Commission about a timeline to discuss the sheriff's submitted budget for which they have not received feedback. Commissioner Childers asked Ms. Hart when budget can be expected. Ms. Hart could not provide date, said she has been working on 2016 budget, and when completed, she will complete 2015 budget amendment. Discussion followed.

Judy Dollarhite asked for clarification with regards to how and when a timeline to budget amendments are discussed. The Commission clarified that there is no statutory requirement to amend the budget, but that the County Commission can amend twice a year, and historically, amendments to the budget has occurred in the fall. To date, there has been no 2015 budget amendment.

Presiding Commissioner Weter asked Mr. McNiel if he had other comments. Mr. McNiel said he feels that his concern has been adequately aired to the Commission and he understands that no action will be taken today. The Commission will consider how to amend the budget, whom to disburse, and how to get the funds transferred to appropriate offices. Discussion followed.

Ms. Hart asked to address what she perceives as accusations from Mr. McNiel with regards to her withholding money from any County department. She states that she harbors no ill-will towards any department, but is currently delinquent on some tasks.

Mr. Peterson asked about the logistics in expediting the budget amendment. Commission addressed the requirements and protocol to which they are bound. The earliest an amendment could be voted would be end of December.

The meeting was closed at 11:03 AM The County Commission completed the scheduled meeting for today and will resume session on December 7, 2015.

RIGHT OF WAY DEED

THIS DEED is made and entered into this <u>lot</u> day of <u>Movember</u>, 2015, by and between <u>Cavelyn Suc Willer</u> John N Willer Of Christian County, Missouri, hereinafter referred to as "Grantor") and CHRISTIAN COUNTY, MISSOURI, a political subdivision of the State of Missouri, its successors, administrators and assigns, all of which are hereinafter collectively referred to as "Grantee."

WITNESSETH, that the Grantor, in consideration of the sum of One and No/100 Dollars (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration to it paid by the Grantee, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, does by these presents grant, bargain, sell, convey, and confirm unto said Grantee, its successors and assigns, a Right of Way easement for construction, improvement, reconstruction and maintenance of a right of way for public use as a street, roadway thoroughfare or related purposes, including without limitation, the use of conduits, water, gas, sewer pipes, poles, wires, surface drainage facilities, ducts, cables on, over, along, across, and under the following described tracts or parcels of real estate in the County of Christian, State of Missouri, to-wit:

See Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME, together with all and singular the rights, privileges and appurtenances and immunities thereunto belong or in any way appertaining, unto the said Grantee, and unto to its successors and assigns forever; the **Grantor** further covenanting on its part and on behalf of its heirs and assigns that it is lawfully seized of title to the real estate through which said easement is granted and that it has good and lawful right to convey said easement to the **Grantee** herein; that the premises are fee and clear of any encumbrances done or suffered by **Grantor** or those under whom **Grantor** claims; and that said **Grantor** will warrant and defend the title to the said premises unto the said **Grantee** and unto its successors and assigns forever against the lawful claims and demands of all persons whomsoever, except the lien of taxes for the current year and thereafter, special taxes and assessments becoming a lien after the date hereof, all covenants, restrictions, easements, reservations, and other matters of record and a billboard advertising sign lease applicable to the property.

GRANTOR, to the fullest extent allowed by law, including, without limitation, Section 527.188, RSMo. (2006), hereby waives any right to request vacation of the easement herein granted.

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
