A quorum was established. Presiding Commissioner Phillips entertained a motion to approve the consent agenda, which included Christian County Commission's agenda for today, June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020 as amended and Christian County Commission's regular session minutes dated June 11<sup>th</sup>, 2020. There are no financials. Eastern Commissioner Robertson so moved. Western Commissioner Bilyeu seconded the motion.

The Commission met for a COVID-19 update, specifically regarding the Stay at Home order. Presiding Commissioner Phillips reminded everyone that we continue to be in a state of emergency in effect until December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020. Today's business is to amend the current Stay at Home Order No. 05-29-2020-01 so that it can expire at 11:59 p.m. on today, June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020. This removes the restrictions that were previously put in place and allows business as usual, with the strong recommendation to follow CDC guidelines such as social distancing. Presiding Commissioner Phillips entertained a motion to approve Order No. 06-15-2020-01 Amendment & Expiration of Order No. 05-29-2020-01. Western Commissioner Bilyeu so moved. Eastern Commissioner Robertson seconded the motion.

Collector Nichols inquired about this new order affecting how citizens and employees enter the courthouses. Western Commissioner Bilyeu answered by stating that it will be determined on an ongoing basis with the Sheriff's Office. The amendment and expiration of the stay at home order does not specify entry protocols on the County buildings. Presiding Commissioner Phillips noted that this is a fluid situation, there are continuous updates and monitoring.
