Resource Management Department 2022 – 1st Quarter Report to the County Commission



April 10, 2022

Planning and Development Department

During this first quarter of 2022, staff has continued to work with the Southwest Missouri Council of Governments on the update to the Christian County Comprehensive Plan which was last done in 2009. We have hosted several meetings with the Comp Plan steering committee which is comprised of citizens having a wide array of interests, expertise, and knowledge about our county.



Together we have developed a draft set of goals and objectives which are now being presented to the public for comment in a series of open house type events at the Sparta and Clever Library locations.

Residential Development

The climate for residential development continues to be strong. During the first three months of this year our office processed 28 Administrative Minor Subdivision applications resulting in 44 new parcels which are potential residential building sites.

Staff continues to meet with developers regarding additional residential developments which will proceed through the Major Subdivision process in the coming months. We currently have several projects at various stages in the process. Those developments represent additional population growth occurring in Christian County near the existing city limits of Nixa and the Clever area.

Commercial Development

While our office continues to work with developers on various prospective and ongoing projects throughout the County, the lack of public sewer and water infrastructure in the unincorporated county limits the desirability for some businesses to locate outside the urbanized core. As always, we regularly work with the Cities of Ozark and Nixa through our Urban Service Area Agreement referring potential commercial projects which could be developed utilizing municipal water and sewer.

Despite this lack of desirable utility infrastructure, we do have projects which will contribute to growth in the commercial sector.

- A micro-brewery in the Chadwick area
- Gateway Café is being rebuilt
- A new mini storage facility is in the works
- Commercial infill for a wedding venue on Guin Rd.
- Several other modest structures for service type businesses

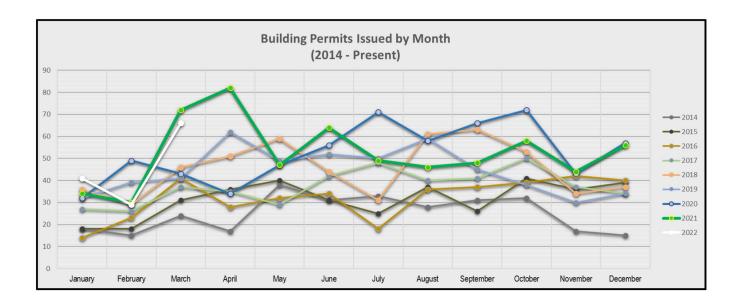
Building Inspections

The climate for construction in Christian County remains strong and seems unaffected by the extreme costs of labor and materials.

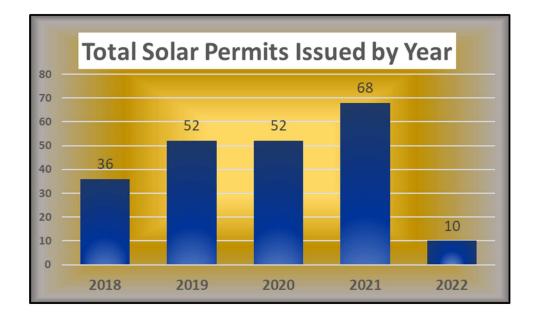


Our total first quarter permits issued was 136 which is exactly the same as last year at this time.

Lee and Bobby at the recycling center continue to do a great job every day operating and maintaining this facility.

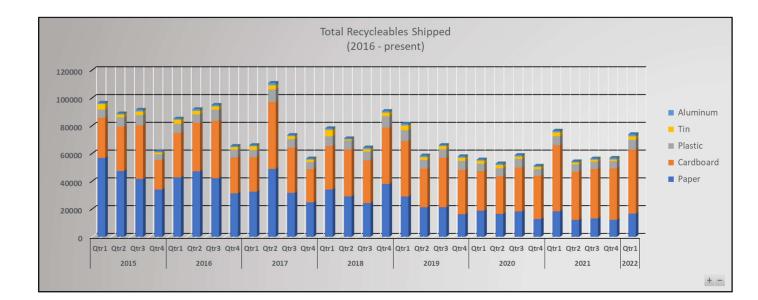
Toward the end of 2021 we submitted a grant application to the Ozark Headwaters Recycling District to fund the purchase of a new electric forklift

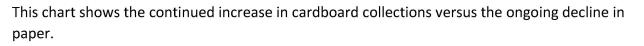


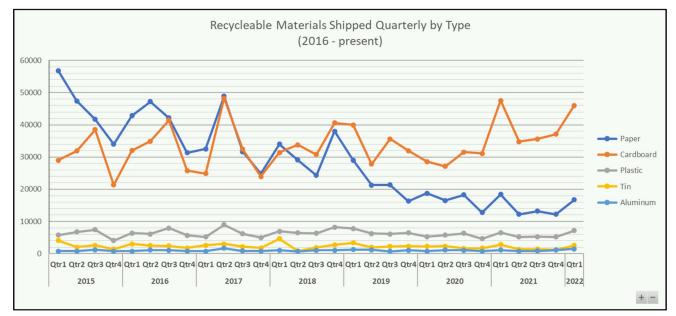
to replace our current 1985 model Case skid steer which frequently needs repair and for which parts are no longer available. Due to the extraordinary number of applications OHRD received, they were only able to partially fund most requests. As such, we were awarded \$11,940.74 which is about 47% of our request. Our hope is that the Commission will agree to fund the remaining portion. This particular piece of equipment was selected in anticipation of constructing a new Recycling Center at the future campus. The loading dock there would be the point of delivery for maintenance and other departments. This forklift would then be utilized to serve the needs of many departments.

Collections

Collections through the first three months of 2022 are very similar to last year. It is important to understand that the numbers presented here actually based on the weights calculated as baled materials are weighed prior to being shipped out. As the pickup schedule is only periodic, the value of this information is mainly in its depiction of trends.







Environmental



The end of the floodplain mapping update project seems to be drawing near. In early March, FEMA published notice a notice of our proposed flood hazard determinations in the Federal Register and also published a public notification of the appeals process in the Christian County Headliner for two consecutive weeks.

The notice published by FEMA includes website information the public may utilize to examine the maps and how to file an appeal. Our office has also provided similar access to the proposed maps for the past two years through the County website and has also had paper copies available at the Planning Office. We are currently within the 90 day appeal period which began March 16, 2022. Following this 90 day period and the resolution of any appeals and comments, FEMA will send a Letter of Final Determination which will lead to an effective date of these new maps.

Our Facility

Its been a fairly busy start to the year in terms of visitors coming to our building to use the large room for meetings. Our plan is to continue to encourage social distancing, provide sanitizer and masks, and continue to provide a temperature check station as a means of reducing risk to employees and visitors. If infection numbers continue to trend low as weather warms, we hope to remove the plexiglass barrier at our front counter.

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Director, Resource Management Department

April 12, 2022 Quarterly Report-1st quarter

Landscaping

- We added 3 pin oak trees and 4 redbud trees to the east side of the Courthouse lawn.
- We completed landscaping at the basement door entrance at Historic Courthouse.
- Ordered 12 36" long x 24" wide rectangle planters for the concrete pad on the southeast corner of the lawn.
- We added 4 outdoor permanent trash cans to the courthouse lawn.
- Both power and water have been installed at the Southeast corner shipping and receiving area for events. This was a cost share between the County and the City. Each paid half of the total \$7,127.89 The City also provided the electrical hand hold and components, as well as installing the water supply at their expense.
- We have ordered one additional light ballard to be placed in front of the cannon on the Northeast corner of the square.
- We are currently adding flower beds in front of the cannon and the Northwest corner of the square. We will also be placing flowers at the gazebo around new pavers as needed.
- All concrete work on the county sidewalks has been completed.
- Building maintenance has purchased and installed 4 picnic tables and multiple benches to be placed around the square for seating.
- We are currently working on bids for air duct cleaning in multiple County buildings
- Yearly jail lock maintenance started Monday April 11th.
- Building maintenance has installed a new ice machine for the County Jail.
- We have currently addressed the kitchen hood vent issues.
- All elevator inspections have been completed from 2021, however we are waiting for permits from the state. I am currently working with the Department of Public Safety to get some issues resolved and will update at a later time.
- Bi-yearly HVAC filter changes will start when jail lock maintenance is completed in approximately 2 weeks.
- Maintenance crews will continue to address issues on the Courthouse lawn. This is settling due to excavation and will fix and reseed areas as needed.
- On April 12th the maintenance crew cut down 113 Bradford pear trees at the ranch as requested by Hosea Bilyeu.
- Jail generator controls were replaced on March 30th. Transfer switch will be repaired on Thursday April 14th. Central Power Systems will perform preventative maintenance on the transfer switch. This should fix any remaining issues with the Jail generator.
- Work on the gazebo should be completed by the end of May. This includes sanding in the brick pavers and all landscaping around the gazebo.
- General maintenance continues- plumbing, electrical, HVAC and yard work as needed.

Budget

- There is currently 67% left in the building maintenance budget for the year.
- Custodial supplies set at 83%
- we will be watching elevator maintenance. We are at 37% at this time. Elevator maintenance is low due to a new unfunded mandate by the State of Missouri. Rupture values must now be tested every 5 years.

FIRST ADDENDUM TO COST SHARE AGREEMENT FOR HOLIDAY LIGHTING

THIS FIRST ADDENDUM TO THE COST SHARE AGREEMENT FOR HOLIDAY

LIGHTING, dated the 29^{TH} day November, 2021, by and between the Christian County, Missouri (hereinafter referred to as "County") and The City of Ozark, Missouri (hereinafter referred to as "City") and the Historic River District (hereinafter referred to as "HRD") is made and entered into and effective as of this <u>19</u>Th day of <u>19</u>Th day of <u>19</u>Th day of

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties hereto entered into an Cost Share Agreement for Holiday Lighting dated November 29, 2021 (hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement") regarding the expenditure of revenues to purchase and install annual holiday lighting; and

WHEREAS, The County, City, and HRD now desire to amend their previous Agreement by this Addendum so that each party contributes less to the purchase of holiday lighting; and

WHEREAS, The County, City, and HRD are authorized to amend their previous Agreement as the parties agreed in paragraph 8 of said Agreement that it could be amended, in writing, if executed by the parties hereto; and

WHEREAS, The County, City, and HRD desire that the Cost Sharing Agreement remain in full force and effect, except as amended herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises set forth herein, County, City and HRD agree that the Cost Share Agreement for Holiday Lighting, dated November 29, 2021 is hereby amended as follows:

1. The provisions of paragraph 2 of the Cost Share Agreement are hereby amended to state as follows:

"2. Purchase of Holiday Lighting. To facilitate the Holiday Lighting, a onetime purchase of the light installations must be made. The HRD shall make the purchase of the Holiday Lighting which is estimated to be a onetime cost of Twenty Thousand Dollars and no/100 (\$20,000.00). The parties to this agreement shall each share in this one-time cost as follows:

- a. HRD shall pay Ten Thousand Dollars and no/100 (\$10,000.00).
- b. County shall pay Five Thousand Dollars and no/100 (\$5,000.00).
- c. City shall pay Five Thousand Dollars and no/100 (\$5,000.00).

Upon receiving an invoice from HRD, the County and City shall pay their respective amounts to HRD within thirty (30) days from receipt of said invoice. Upon request from the County or City, HRD shall make available any receipts invoices or other regular forms of proof of payment documents for the Holiday Lighting."

2. Except as expressly stated herein, County, City and HRD reaffirm each and every term of the Cost Share Agreement, as modified by this Addendum. To the extent of any constant between this Addendum and the Cost Share Agreement, this Addendum shall control.
