FREE Emergency Preparedness Training for Your Community!



Preparedness programs are national, standardized and free for community members taught by certified presenters. They are designed to help participants understand, prepare for and respond appropriately to emergencies through engaging and age-appropriate curriculum.

Disaster and Emergency Preparedness for Youth

Prepare with Pedro

Kindergarten–2nd Grade

A 30–45 min preparedness program for students that follows Pedro the Penguin and his friends as they learn how to be prepared and take action during an emergency.

The Pillowcase Project

3rd–5th Grade

A 40–60 min presentation that covers local hazards, coping skills and personal and family preparedness through a “Learn, Practice, Share” framework.

Disaster and Emergency Preparedness for Adults

Be Red Cross Ready

The presentation is designed to teach people how to prepare for and respond appropriately to disasters likely to occur in their community such as hurricanes, wildfires, earthquakes, tornadoes, etc.

Hands Only CPR

A 30 min training teaching hands-only technique for CPR. Participants learn how to check for consciousness, call 911 (or the local emergency number) and give continuous chest compressions.

CPR training certification is not provided through this course.

Ready Rating

A 30 min presentation explaining our free membership program to help businesses, schools, or organizations become better prepared for disasters and other emergencies.

Disaster Response

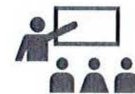

Responded to nearly 370 home fires in Southern Missouri



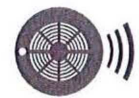
Enrolled nearly 9,000 people in other health and safety courses

Home Fire Campaign

Home fires take seven lives a day in the U.S., but working smoke alarms can cut the risk of death by half. That's why the American Red Cross is installing free smoke alarms and sharing fire safety information through our Home Fire Campaign. Since the campaign launched in 2014, we've helped nearly 1,500 lives across the country. This critical work is made possible with the support of our partners, who have helped us install nearly 2.5 million free smoke alarms in vulnerable homes.

Training Services

Swift action when an emergency occurs can save a life. The American Red Cross teaches and empowers more than 4.8 million people annually through training courses. In the last year, over 61,000 individuals in Missouri learned critical skills through Red Cross courses, including First Aid/CPR/AED and water safety.

Enrolled over 1,100 people in water safety/aquatics



Enrolled 30 people in caregiving courses

Service to the Armed Forces

The Red Cross Hero Care Network provides support to service members and their families pre-deployment, during deployment and when they return home, through emergency communication services, financial assistance programs, re-integration and veteran services.



Provided over 700 emergency case services to military members and their families



Provided nearly 630 critical case services to military members, veterans, and families



Briefed nearly 200 military enlistees and families through our "Get to Know Us" program

Blood Services

The Red Cross is the single largest supplier of blood in the United States, providing nearly 40 percent of the nation's blood supply. Blood and platelets are needed for many reasons— accident and burn victims, heart surgery patients, organ transplant patients, and those receiving treatment for leukemia, cancer or sickle cell disease may all need blood.



Conducted over 650 blood drives in Southern Missouri



Collected over 11,000 whole blood, platelet, and plasma donations
