



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


Alternate A – Grinder and Pumps





Alt. A – Profile Schematic




Alternate B – Gravity to Oak St

Purchasing Update:

Year-End Closeout Procedures

- Lowes--On October 11, 2023, the Purchasing Manager met with Lowes National Representative Gary Turnage, and Resource Management Office Manager. Rep explained the new program for Lowes with rebates offered; we originally were not on this program. The following issues were discussed:
 - o 2% discount Lowes key fob is obsolete.
 - A 5% discount on the Lowes credit card is still in effect.
 - 2% rebate on all purchases up to \$25,000 in sales from January through December. Note: To date, we have spent over \$14,000.
 - Online portal navigation
 - The County will receive a rebate check from Lowes in March 2024. The rebate check will be sent to Christian County. Our rep said he would email me when a check has been cut.
- JCI—On October 10, 2023, Maintenance Supervisor and Purchasing Manager met with Johnson Controls representative Jessie De la Rosa. The three of us spoke about the issues we were having. Through this collaboration, a partnership between JCI and Christian County was formed, utilizing a State of Missouri contract.
- Kone—Elevator Maintenance & Repair was bid and awarded to a new vendor, Kone.
 Three bids were received. Over the contract's life, we will save approximately \$20,000 from our previous contractor.
- Vital Records—A company that many of our departments use, was arbitrarily adding a new \$20 fee for 2 Standard Gigabytes of storage, which we did not request. Purchasing contacted VRC and discovered that you had to get them to opt out of the program. Purchasing got the Recorder of Deeds, Prosecutor's Office (who already knew), and Circuit Clerk to have them opt out of the program. I wrote up the verbiage to send to them for the cancellation.
- PO Aging Reports October 19th and December 14th
 PO Aging Report was run twice in the 4th quarter and distributed to all County
 Offices/Departments by Purchasing Assistant. This report is a "clean up" report for Audit
 and Purchasing. Purchasing will continue to work with the departments to verify what
 purchase orders are current for end-of-year procedures.
- New County Procurement Credit Cards
 The Treasurer issued new bank cards for the County Offices/Departments from Central
 Trust Bank. We changed from Ozark Bank because we were not receiving any benefits
 like cash rebates at the end of the year. The Treasurer asked Purchasing to coordinate
 the delivery of the new cards and the receipt of the old Ozark bank cards, and we did.
- WEX Fuel Card—The County fuel card for County vehicles. The Auditor informed Purchasing Manager that WEX began charging \$2.00 per card/per month. We worked with WEX and switched WEX to the State of Missouri contract. Now, the County will receive benefits like 1.75% off the posted pump price. It is received as a quarterly credit on our invoice. We weren't even set up with tax exemption.
- IGA—We issued an IGA to Buchannan County on October 24, 2023, and we're happy to report they piggybacked on a procurement we did. They purchased security equipment from our contract with Secure Tech.
- Recycling on Campus: Greenway Recycling was on campus with the Recycling Center, the Collector, and the Public Administrator's office. Greenway went out of business and failed to contact the County. With their permission, Purchasing switched the Collector and Public Administration Offices to Big Bear Shredding utilizing the State's contract. We issued a new bid for the Recycling Center, and Republic Services received the contract.
- Shred-It (another recycling company) was on campus, and their costs were too high.
 With their permission, Purchasing switched Juvenile and the Prosecutor's Office from Shred-It to Big Bear Shredding using the State of Missouri contract.
- Panic Button Alarms: On December 4, 2023, CC Purchasing Manager met with Secure Tech representative Juliana Goldenberg, along with CC Campus Security Sergeant, Maintenance Supervisor, and IT Manager, to discuss the rollout of the panic button

- alarms. On December 11, 2023, they were installed by Secure Tech's and appear to be successful, according to Campus Security Sergeant.
- On November 21, 2023, the Treasurer's Office sent a letter to all our outgoing checks to vendors. This is to help our online vendor database grow. It went out to 50 vendors.
- Contract Report Distributed: One of the items Purchasing is most proud of distributing is the first-ever contract reports to the County's Officials and Department Heads. This is a crowning moment for the County and Purchasing.
- MAC Award: Christian County received a 2024 MAC award for Innovation and Digitization Through eProcurment. The Purchasing Manager and the Presiding Commissioner accepted the award on behalf of the County.

Missouri Association of Public Purchasing (MAPP):

- On November 15, 2023, a virtual Missouri County Purchasing Lunch & Learn was held. Miscellaneous procurement topics were discussed. Five counties attended.
- On December 8, 2023, Kim Hopkins-Will was sworn in as president of MAPP for the 2024 calendar year.



Planning and Development Department

The Fourth quarter of 2023 brought change to the Planning and Development Department staff. We added Scott Hayes as our Senior Planner. Scott brings excellent education and experience having worked in Tulsa and in Willard as their Planning Administrator. We hope he will have a long career with the County. We also had a former employee,



Brenna Howard, return to our office as the Permitting Coordinator after leaving for a while to work for the Highway Patrol. We are very glad to have her back. Lastly, the end of the year marked the departure of Joan Doss, our Planning Administrator. She and her husband are moving to lowa for a career opportunity and to be closer to relatives as they start their new family. Joan will be missed, but we will endeavor to fill her role quickly and return to full staffing.

Land Use Change


The Planning and Development Department staff, working through the Planning and Zoning Commission and the County Commission presented a significant number of requests for land use change throughout 2023.

- 20 rezoning requests were recommended for approval by the Planning and Zoning Commission involving a total of 198.55 acres.
- 3 Conditional Use Permit requests were approved affecting 7 acres


Investment in Christian County

The Planning and Development and Building Inspections Departments work hand in hand to help guide and facilitate investment in the physical development of Christian County. Each construction permit issued generates an estimated IBC valuation which is calculated and assigned based upon project type, use group and square footage. While these numbers are only an estimation, they do help to illustrate the value being added within the unincorporated areas of the County.

Residential Development

The climate for residential development continues to be strong. This last year our office processed 99 Administrative Minor Subdivision applications and re-plats resulting in the creation of 118 new parcels which are potential residential building sites.

Five named subdivisions were approved in 2023 resulting in 82 residential lots.

Staff continues to work with developers regarding new residential developments which will proceed through the Major Subdivision process in the coming months. We currently have Five projects at various stages of the platting process. These projects contain a combined total of 86 additional residential lots. Those developments represent additional population growth occurring in Christian County near the existing city limits of Nixa and Ozark as well as in the Clever and Billings areas. If we reasonably assume that these current projects have their respective plats approved in 2024 and add a typical annual amount of administrative minor subdivision lots, the County can look forward to another year of continued growth in terms of creating new parcels and lots for residential development.

This all suggests that the building inspectors will continue to have a steady supply of residential inspections to perform for the foreseeable future.

Commercial Development

While our office continues to work with developers on various prospective and ongoing projects throughout the County, the lack of public sewer and water infrastructure in the unincorporated county limits the desirability for some businesses to locate outside the urbanized core. As always, we regularly work with the Cities of Ozark and Nixa through our Urban Service Area Agreement referring potential commercial projects which could be developed utilizing municipal water and sewer.

Despite this lack of desirable utility infrastructure, we did facilitate several projects throughout the year which contributed to growth in the commercial sector.

- An O'Riley Automotive store on CC Hwy
- Fremont Hills City Hall
- A new 12,300 square foot \$3.5 million White River Electric Cooperative facility just east of Ozark on Hwy 14.
- A large mini storage facility on Rose Hill Rd. in the Billings area
- Commercial remodel of the Old Motor Company building in Billings
- Ongoing addition and remodel of Fire Station on Hwy W

Code Enforcement

Our office routinely fields calls from citizens who wish to file a complaint or report a violation of one or more of our adopted regulations. After collecting information about the situation and making on-site investigations from the public right-of-way, we will find that some cases involve aspects which are addressed within the regulations while others may not.





The numbers above do not include the numerous complaint related calls and inquiries our staff receive regularly, which are addressed or resolved without escalating to formal complaints or notices of violation being sent out.

Building Inspections


While the climate for construction in Christian County during 2023 remained strong, our department did experience a slight decline in the overall number of permits issued over the course of the year. The department issued 555 permits over the course of 2023. Despite this slight decline in overall activity, it was still a strong year. The declines we have seen are in both the number of new residential projects and also the average size of homes. This is surely impacted by the current interest rates along with increased costs of materials and labor. Over the 4th quarter, we issued 113 permits which was our slowest 4th quarter total since 2019. This capped a second half of 2023 which was slightly slower than the first half as the department issued the majority of its total permits between January and June. This gradual decline may likely continue absent any significant economic changes at the regional or national level.





Throughout the year, the Building Inspections staff performed very well in keeping up with the relatively strong construction environment in Christian County. One of our full-time inspectors was limited during the second half of the year due to a serious health issue. Our team did a great job in finding ways to cover all inspections in a timely manner during this period.


The movement of Carrie Reed taking over as the department's Permit Tech has been a huge success. She has done an excellent job in this new role.





Over the course of 2023, our inspectors performed a total of 2,077 construction related inspections along with an additional 360 pre-construction site inspections.


Collectively our Inspectors logged 43,977 miles while performing inspections which helps illustrate the time and expense required to provide inspection services covering the 560 square miles within the County borders.

The following charts illustrate the dispersion of projects for which permits were issued by our Building Inspections Department as well as the type of inspections performed.











The graphic above gives some insight into the type of new residential construction taking place in the County. 2023 brought a dramatic shift in the average square footage of new residences. While the overall number of new residences is comparable, it's clear that the trend was toward more modest dwellings.



We are continuing to track the growth in the number of permits issued for solar panel installation. In 2023, 41 solar panel permits were issued which is a significant decline from 2022.




Recycling Center

Lee and Bobby at the recycling center continued to do a great job every day operating and maintaining this facility. These men are also tasked with transporting collected materials from our remote drop off sites in Sparta and Billings as well as making smaller pickups from County buildings and other various local businesses with significant amounts of materials.





In addition to serving as a place where materials are diverted from landfills for re-use, our Recycling Center also provides opportunities for citizens to fulfill their Court mandated community service requirements. Over the course of 2023, 44 individuals were able to have their time working at the Recycling Center verified and reported to the Court.





Collections

Collections during 2023 were again slightly higher than the preceding year. The Recycling Center reported shipping a total of 263,934 lbs of materials which is nearly identical to the previous year's totals.



This chart shows the continued increase in cardboard collections versus the ongoing decline in paper. We did, however, see an unusual spike in the third quarter.





In November we submitted a grant application to the Ozarks Headwaters Recycling District (District O) for some new and durable self-dumping hopper containers. This equipment will be a perfect fit with our newer electric forklift and be part of our efficiency plans for the new recycling center location.

Environmental



The end of the floodplain mapping update project was finally completed in 2023. The Commission approved an Order to adopt a revised Floodplain Ordinance which references the new maps.

Work also continues on the countywide stormwater improvements project. The County Commission has had an opportunity to review the various

potential projects. Now, based upon the projected impact and and comparison with other viable projects and the amount of funding which has been designated for this purpose, selections will be made and work will take place in 2024.

Our Facility at 1106 W. Jackson





Elm Street, Suite 70 Ozark, MO 65721 This Contract is entered into between Christian County, Missouri on behalf of the Christian County Sheriff's Office ("Agency") and Turn Key Health Clinics, LLC ("Contractor"). The purpose of this Contract is to contract for the Healthcare Personnel and Administration at the Christian County Detention Center in Ozark, Missouri (herein called the "Facility") under the terms and conditions detailed in the Contract.

I. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE CONTRACTOR

1.1 SCOPE OF CONTRACT

The Contractor shall be the supplier and/or coordinator of the health care delivery system at the Facility, as set forth herein. The Contractor shall be responsible for medical care for all inmates (except Work Release inmates who shall, when in the Facility, receive only emergency care from the provider) at the Facility up to the limits described in this Contract. The responsibility of the Contractor for the medical care of an inmate commences with the commitment of the inmate to the custody of the Facility and ends with the release of the inmate.

The entire agreement will consist of the Contract Documents. The term "Contract Documents" shall include the Staffing Matrix attached hereto as Exhibit A. Additionally, the Contract Documents will consist of (listed in order from highest to lowest precedence): Change Orders / Amendments (as applicable), Agreement, Response to BAFO (if applicable), Request for BAFO (if applicable), Addenda to RFP, RFP, and the Agency's Proposal (but not the exceptions).

Definitions:

RFP / Addenda to RFP - RFP #2023-25 & Addendums 1&2

Change Order / Amendment – a change to the Contract Documents in a written document signed by the parties after they have signed the Agreement.

BAFO – the Best and Final offer of the Contractor that is in response to a Request for Proposal.

Request for BAFO – The document issued by Christian County that incorporates the terms negotiated by the parties following the opening of the Response to RFP and requests Contractor to make his best and final offer.

1.2 INSURANCE

The Contractor will carry professional liability insurance in minimum amounts of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) in the aggregate annually during the entire term and any renewal term of this Contract.

1.3 COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAW

The Contractor will comply with the standards set forth by the Missouri Department of Health and Jail Standards for the State of Missouri for the duration of the term of this Agreement with the Agency.

1.4 CONTRACTOR COOPERATION

All Contractor personnel, including the personnel of its subcontractor and agents, will be subject to security background checks and clearances by the Agency. In each instance, the individual and the Contractor will provide such cooperation as may be reasonably required to complete the security check. The Agency agrees to perform such security checks in a timely manner and not unduly delay such checks.

1.5 PHARMACEUTICAL

The Contractor shall provide for pharmaceutical management services to assure the availability of prescribed medications within a reasonable time period of the order of issue being written except where such medications are not readily available in the local community. In order to facilitate the timely administration of medications, the Agency agrees to allow the use of an inmate's home medication, as appropriate, upon the verification of the medication by Contractor personnel.

The Contractor shall provide a method for the recording of the administration of medications by Agency and/or Contractor personnel on a pre-approved form that includes documentation of the fact that inmates are receiving and ingesting their prescribed medications. Medication administration and medication documentation training shall be made available for Agency staff, upon request, for times when Contractor personnel are not at the Facility to administer medications.

The Contractor will negotiate discounted rates with a pharmacy licensed in the State of Missouri. The Contractor will be responsible to pay the costs of all pharmaceutical as required by current applicable law and subject to the Maximum Liability provision listed in Subsection 1.9.

1.6 HOSPITALIZATION, OFF-SITE SERVICES AND SPECIALTY CARE

Contractor will arrange for hospitalization, off-site (outside the Facility) services, and specialty care for inmates who, in the opinion of the treating provider and/or the medical director, require treatment beyond what is provided at the Facility, including dental services. Contractor will defer claims for such services that can be paid by the patient or other responsible party. Claims for such services that are not paid by the patient or other responsible party shall be the responsibility of the Contractor, subject to the Maximum Liability provision listed in Subsection 1.9. However, nothing in this Subsection shall prevent or impede the Agency from transporting inmates whom the Agency determines, in its own discretion, to require emergent medical treatment outside of the Facility.

1.7 LABORATORY AND RADIOLOGY SERVICES

Contractor shall arrange laboratory and radiology services to be performed on-site (within the Facility) to the extent reasonably practicable. The Contractor shall make appropriate off-site arrangements for required laboratory and radiology services that cannot be rendered on-site. Contractor will arrange and coordinate with the Sheriff's Office for the transportation for such

off-site services. Contractor will defer claims for such services that can be paid by the patient or other responsible party. Claims for such services that are not paid by the patient or other responsible party shall be the responsibility of the Contractor, subject to the Maximum Liability provision listed in Subsection 1.9.

1.8 TRANSPORTATION

The cost of emergency medical transportation will be considered an off-site service per Section 1.6. Costs for such services shall be the responsibility of the Contractor, subject to the Maximum Liability provision listed in Subsection 1.9. All other non-emergent transportation relating to the provision of health services shall be also be the responsibility of the Agency, not the Contractor.

1.9 FINANCIAL LIABILITY FOR NON-CONTRACTOR SERVICES

Contractor's maximum liability for services pursuant to Sections 1.5, 1.6, 1.7, and 1.8, including but not limited to hospitalizations, inmate transportation, off-site medical care, diagnostic services, specialty consultation and services, off-site dental services, medical waste, medications, required prosthesis, and individual medical devices shall be \$33,000.00, and all financial liability in excess of the \$33,000.00 cap shall be the responsibility of the Agency, not the Contractor.

1.10 INMATES FROM OTHER JURISDICTIONS

The Contractor will provide on-site services for inmates incarcerated at the Facility for the Missouri Department of Corrections, Missouri municipalities, the U.S. Marshals, the Federal Bureau of Prisons, and/or other custodial jurisdictions. However, hospitalizations, off-site services, specialty services, and pharmaceutical costs associated with inmates from other jurisdictions shall not be the responsibility of the Contractor. The Contractor shall promptly notify the Jail Administrator for any needed pharmaceutical, specialty service or off-site services for such inmates and shall provide documentation of required treatment to the custodial jurisdiction as requested. Upon receipt, the Contractor shall submit all related bills to the Agency for appropriate processing.

1.11 IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY

Up to the limits stated in Mo. Ann. Stat. § 537.610, the Contractor agrees to indemnify and to hold the Agency harmless for, from, and against claims, suits, reasonable attorney's fees, damages, or injuries to persons or property or other liabilities arising out of the sole negligence of the Contractor or the Contractor's personnel to properly provide medical care or administration pursuant to the terms of this Contract; including but not limited to claims for violation of privacy, medical malpractice, governmental enforcement or remedial actions, federal or state discrimination claims and tort actions.

Immunity from liability and/or indemnity shall not extend to the Agency for the actions, omission of action, neglect, the prevention of any person from receiving medical care, or the lack of personnel training, by the Agency or any Agency personnel or agents.

The Contractor shall not be responsible for any claims arising from the negligence or torts on the part of the Agency or any Agency personnel or agents in promptly and/or accurately presenting a

person to the appropriate Contractor's personnel or independent contractors if it should have been reasonably known that the individual was in need of medical attention, or in denying the Contractor or its personnel access to treat any such individuals in need of medical attention. The Contractor shall not be responsible for the failure of the Agency or Agency personnel or agents to obtain emergency medical care in the event Contractor personnel are not available at the Facility.

The Agency shall hold harmless the Contractor and the Contractor's officers and personnel against any loss or damage, including attorney's fees or other litigation costs, caused or necessitated by the sole negligence of the Agency, Agency employees and agents, and/or other vendors which is related to medical treatment or care.

The terms and provisions of this Section 1.11 shall survive the termination of this Contract.

1.12 THIRD PARTY PAYORS

The Contractor shall assist with obtaining private health insurance information, whenever possible, to help ensure claims are billed appropriately for applicable off-site and specialty care medical expenses. However, in no event shall any patient be denied access to appropriate medical care due to a lack of insurance coverage, nor shall insurance coverage and/or a patient's financial condition be taken into consideration when rendering medical care or in the exercise of medical decision-making by the Contractor or its personnel.

1.13 INMATE MEDICAL FEE FOR SERVICE SYSTEM

The Contractor and Agency may implement an inmate fee for medical services program for medical encounters as directed by the Agency. Any inmate charges will be established by the Agency in accordance with Missouri State Statutes. Fees for services shall be collected directly by the Agency and will be utilized by the Agency. The Contractor will not be responsible to collect any of the fees from the inmates.

1.14 NEGOTIATION OF DISCOUNTS

Contractor shall use its best efforts to negotiate discounts for medical services and pharmaceuticals. The Agency will be allowed to use the contractual discounts negotiated by the Contractor.

1.15 PERSONNEL RECORD KEEPING

The Contractor shall, upon request, provide to the Agency proof of licenses and/or certificates for all Contractor professional staff. Personnel files of Contractor's employees assigned to the Facility shall be maintained at the Contractor's corporate office and shall be available to the Agency upon written request.

1.16 HEALTHCARE PERSONNEL SERVICES PROVIDED

All medical and mental health personnel providing services through the Contractor under this Contract shall be the employees and/or agents of the Contractor and not of the Agency. Such

individuals shall hereby be referred to as the "Healthcare Personnel". All wages, worker's compensation, insurance, benefits, vacations, and claims of any kind relating to the Healthcare Personnel provided by the Contractor shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor and not of the Agency. Healthcare Personnel associated with the terms of this contract shall not include employees and/or agents of the Agency.

- 1. Contractor shall provide medical unit coverage pursuant to Exhibit A:
- 2. A physician or midlevel provider who will provide 24 hours a day, seven days a week, EMERGENCY on-call coverage for consultation on an as needed basis.
- 2. The Healthcare Personnel shall perform medical and dental intake screenings while at the Facility. Intake screenings performed by detention staff while Healthcare Personnel are not at the Facility shall be reviewed by Healthcare Personnel within forty-eight hours of being conducted. Inmates identified with significant health concerns will be scheduled for follow-up care, as appropriate.
- 3. Healthcare Personnel shall administer medications, as prescribed, while at the Facility;
- 4. Healthcare Personnel shall conduct sick call triage and follow-up, as indicated; and
- 5. Healthcare Personnel shall provide appropriate and timely response to medical needs and emergencies during regularly scheduled hours at the Facility.

1.17 SATISFACTION WITH HEALTHCARE PERSONNEL

In recognition with the sensitive nature of the Facility's operation, if the Agency becomes dissatisfied with any member of the Contractor's Healthcare Personnel, the Agency shall provide Contractor written notice of such dissatisfaction and the reason(s) therefore. Following receipt of such notice, Contractor shall use reasonable efforts to resolve the dissatisfaction. If the problem is not resolved to the satisfaction of the Agency within ten (10) business days following the Contractor's receipt of the notice, Contractor shall remove the individual from providing services at the Facility within a reasonable timeframe considering the affects of such removal on Contractor's ability to deliver healthcare services and recruitment/hiring of an acceptable replacement.

1.18 POLICIES AND PROCEDURES / PROTOCOLS

A written manual of the Agency and Contractor's standardized policies and defined procedures will be available at all times for the Contractor's personnel. The Contractor's nursing protocols shall be devised and approved by a physician licensed in the State of Missouri. Policies and procedures and nursing protocols will be reviewed and revised as necessary.

1.19 NON-INMATE HEALTH SERVICES

Non-inmate health services shall be provided in the form of emergency care for Facility staff and visitors for the purpose of stabilizing the condition and arranging for transport. Emergency services include first aid, assessment, stabilization and the coordination of transport of

employees or visitors who become ill or injured in the Facility.

The Contractor shall make available the Hepatitis B vaccination program and annual Tuberculosis Skin Testing (TST) for all Facility staff as requested by the Sheriff. However, the Agency will bear the cost of the vaccine and serum.

1.20 EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

The Contractor shall, in times of emergency or threat thereof, whether accidental, natural or man-made, provide medical assistance to the Facility to the extent or degree required by policies and procedures.

1.21 TESTIFYING IN COURT

Contractor personnel shall be aware that they might, from time to time, be subpoenaed to testify in court or at a deposition regarding medical treatment. Contractor will keep the Agency informed of any and all requests.

1.22 MEDICAL RECORDS REQUIREMENTS

An electronic health record consistent with state regulations and community standards of practice shall be maintained for each inmate held beyond the first appearance in court for services rendered following the inmate's assignment to a housing area. These records shall be kept separate from the jail confinement records of the inmate on a server designated and owned by the Agency.

In any case where medical care is at issue, or in any criminal or civil litigation where the physical or mental condition of an inmate is at issue, the Contractor shall make accessible to the Agency such records and, upon request, provide copies. The Contractor additionally acknowledges compliance with and understanding of all applicable HIPAA requirements as they apply to correctional facilities.

The Contractor acknowledges and agrees that all records prepared or acquired by the Contractor during performance of services under the Contract are the property of the Christian County Sheriff's Office. The Contractor shall be considered the records custodian during the duration of the Contract. Upon the termination of this Contract, all inmate medical records shall remain in the care and custody of the Agency. Inactive medical records will be maintained in accordance with the laws of the State of Missouri.

The Contractor shall be responsible for costs associated with leasing and/or maintenance of the electronic health record software program. However, all costs associated with computer hardware and server maintenance and/or replacement and software other than the electronic health record program shall be the responsibility of the Agency.

II. DUTIES OF AGENCY

2.1 MONTHLY REIMBURSEMENT FOR SERVICES

The reimbursement for the Contract shall be paid by the Agency to the Contractor on a monthly basis. The monthly reimbursement for the month of February 2024 shall be in the amount of Fifty-Eight Thousand, Seven Hundred and Sixty-Nine dollars and Eighty-Two cents (\$58,769.82). All monthly reimbursements shall be eligible to be pro-rated for any partial months and subject to any reconciliation as applicable. The first payment for the month of February 2024 shall be paid to the Contractor by the 1st day of March 2024 for the services administered in the month of February. All subsequent payments shall be paid in the full amount by the Agency to the Contractor by the 1st day of each month for services rendered the previous month.

This Agreement shall cover services provided by the Contractor for the Agency with a facility average daily population (ADP) up to 150 inmates. The ADP will be calculated as the monthly total for all inmates in the jail at 8:00am each day divided by the number of days in that month. Should the ADP exceed 150 inmates for three consecutive months, the Agency agrees to renegotiate the terms of the Contract in good faith.

The Contract shall be subject to an annual increase for the reimbursement for services in the amount not to exceed CPI beginning February 1, 2025 and each subsequent year thereafter.

2.2 USE OF FACILITY, EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES

The Agency shall be responsible for providing the non-exclusive use and access to certain office equipment (phones, computers, etc.), office supplies (chart folders, pens, paper, etc.) durable medical equipment (exam tables, sinks, cabinets, etc.), internet connectivity, and phone service required for the administrative operation of the medical unit. Agency agrees that the Contractor will be provided appropriate space in the Facility to perform all required duties and that the Contractor will be allowed use of the medical office areas, medical equipment, and medical supplies currently at the facility at the initiation of services.

In the event additional durable office or medical equipment needs to be purchased, or existing equipment needs to be repaired, it will be the Agency's responsibility to purchase/repair the required equipment, and it will be owned by the Agency. Provided that, Contractor shall provide and bear the cost of standard disposable medical supplies.

2.3 MEDICAL WASTE

The Agency shall be responsible to arrange for the disposal of medical waste, including infectious or hazardous medical waste. The material must be removed from the Facility and disposed of as regulated by federal, state and local laws. Costs for such services shall be the responsibility of the Agency.

III. CONTRACT TERM

The term of this Contract shall commence on February 1, 2024 and will continue through December 31, 2024. The Contract shall then be eligible for four (4) additional 1 year periods

upon mutual agreement of both parties.

IV. CONTRACT TERMINATION

4.1 TERMINATION

The Agency or Contractor may terminate the Contract for cause or out of convenience at any time by giving written notice to the Contractor of termination, which such notice shall be given not less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the stated effective date of termination.

4.2 PAYMENT UPON TERMINATION

Upon termination of this Contract for any reason, prior to the end of the then existing term, the Contractor will be paid up to the effective termination date such sums and expenses, prorated as necessary, in accordance with those monthly fees described in paragraph 2.1.

4.3 PROPERTY UPON TERMINATION

All health records, Agency policies and procedures, and Agency manuals shall be the property of the Agency and, at the termination of the Contract, shall remain the property of the Agency without further obligation.

V. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

5.1 ALTERATIONS TO CONTRACT

Any alterations, variations, modifications, or waivers of the provisions of the Contract will be valid only if they are reduced to writing, agreed upon by the parties, and attached to the original Contract.

5.2 FORCE MAJEURE

Neither party shall be liable in damages or have the right to terminate this Agreement for any delay or default in performing hereunder if such delay or default is caused by conditions beyond its control including, but not limited to Acts of God, Government restrictions (including the denial or cancellation of any export or other necessary license), wars, insurrections and/or any other cause beyond the reasonable control of the party whose performance is affected.

5.3 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS

It is mutually understood and agreed, and it is the intent of the parties hereto that an independent contractor relationship be and is hereby established under the terms and conditions of this Contract. Nothing in this Contract shall be construed to create an agency relationship, an employer/employee relationship, a joint venture relationship, or any other relationship allowing the Agency to exercise control or direction over the manner or methods by which the Contractor, its employees, agents or subcontractors perform hereunder, or the Contractor to exercise control or direction over the manner or methods by which the Agency and its employees, agents or subcontractors perform hereunder, other than as provided in this Contract.

5.4 SUBCONTRACTING

In order to discharge its obligation hereunder, the Contractor may engage certain physicians as independent contractors rather than employees ("Contract Professionals"). The Contractor shall not engage any Contract Professionals that do not meet the applicable professional licensing requirements and the Contractor shall exercise administrative supervision over such Contract Professionals as necessary to ensure the strict fulfillment of the obligations contained in this Contract. Services provided by Contract Professionals under this Contract shall be provided in a manner reasonably consistent with the independent medical judgment the Contract Professionals are required to exercise.

5.5 AGENCY STATUTORY DELEGATION

For purposes of asserting any statutory rights afforded to the Agency or the Facility to pay providers for medical services at certain reduced rates, Agency designates the Contractor as its agent to assert such rights and privileges.

5.6 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, ancestry, national origin, place of birth, marital status, sexual orientation, age or handicap unrelated to a bona fide occupational qualification of the position or because of status as a disabled veteran or Vietnam-Era veteran. Contractor will distribute copies of its commitment not to discriminate to all persons who participate in recruitment, screening, referral and selection of job applicants, and to prospective job applicants.

5.7 WAIVER OF BREACH

The waiver of either party of a breach or violation of any provision of this Contract shall not operate as, or be construed to be, a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or other provision hereof.

5.8 NOTICES

Any notice of termination, requests, demands or other communications under this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed delivered: (a) when delivered in person to a representative the parties listed: (b) 3 days after mailing when mailed by first-class certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the party at the address below; or (c) upon confirmation of receipt if sent by electronic means or facsimile to the parties listed:

Either party may change such address or phone number from time to time by providing written notice as provided above.

5.9 GOVERNING LAW

This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Missouri regard to the conflicts of laws or rules of any jurisdiction.

5.10 COUNTERPARTS

This Contract may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be considered an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

5.11 TITLE OF PARAGRAPHS AND INTERPRETATION

Titles of paragraphs are inserted solely for convenience of reference and shall not be deemed to limit, expand or otherwise affect the provisions to which they relate. Further, as used in this Contract, the word "or" shall have the conjunctive as well as the disjunctive meaning and refers to alternatives that are not necessarily exclusive. As used in this Contract, references to "include" and similar terms shall be construed as if followed by the phrase "without limitation."

5.12 SEVERABILITY

In the event that any one or more provisions of this Contract shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of this Contract and this Contract shall be construed and enforced as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

5.13 ENTIRE CONTRACT

This Contract constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and is intended as a complete and exclusive statement of the promises, representations, negotiations, discussions and agreements that have been made in connection with the subject matter hereof. This Contract may be amended at any time, but only with the written consent of all parties.

THIS AGREEMENT FOR CONTRACT SERVICES MUST BE SIGNED AND INCLUDED WITH THE BID SUMBISSION. IF AWARDED, THE CONTRACT WILL BE SIGNED AND CERTIFIED BY CHRISTIAN COUNTY AND ONE COPY OF THIS AGREEMENT WILL BE RETURNED TO YOU.

1. KONE to provide the Services set forth below at a cost of \$420.00 per month.

- KONE will commence billing the 24/7 Connected Services on the date shown in this rider/contract with an understanding that the 24/7
 Connected Services may be active in advance of the date shown, or may not be active on the date shown, due to variability in the time
 required to procure material and complete the installation and provisioning of the devices.
- 3. KONE shall program the elevator phone(s) listed above to call the KONE Customer Care Center and will monitor the elevator phone(s). The Customer shall provide names and phone numbers of at least two (2) of its representatives for the KONE Service Center to contact on a 24 hour basis, and at least one (1) police, fire or local 911 agency name and phone number and notify KONE immediately in writing of any changes in these names or numbers. In the event of a call from the elevator, the KONE Customer Care Center will contact the points of contact in the order given by Customer. The local authorities will be contacted only if the previously mentioned point of contacts cannot be reached. If KONE does not provide Wireless Phone Provider Service, Customer shall provide an analog phone line to the elevator machine room (to be terminated on the appropriate phone jacks). If phone line is an extension off an existing phone system, a backup power source must also be provided. An extension, if applicable, must be a direct inward dial (DID) extension. All phones and associated equipment shall be in compliance with the requirements of ASME A17.1, local codes and applicable law, as amended. Customer shall also provide the elevator phone number(s) and/or extension(s) for the phone(s) being programmed. Upon termination of the Agreement a \$500 decommissioning and transfer fee shall apply for any elevator phone that needs reprograming to a different number for emergency monitoring.
- 4. If Wireless Phone Provider Service is selected, then KONE provides the phone connection via a KONE provided wireless service device and the phone connection must be programmed to the KONE Customer Care Center. KONE Care Emergency Phone Monitoring is required. Customer is advised not to disconnect any land line service to the equipment until KONE has installed and provisioned a new wireless 4G device. Customer shall bear the responsibility to reactivate the analog phone line in the event KONE can no longer provide wireless service. Customer shall also provide KONE access to the appropriate location where the building telecommunications devices are located. KONE reserves the right to remove the wireless hardware in the event KONE no longer provides the wireless service or maintains the equipment.
- 5. The remote monitoring devices are provided to the Customer as part of the Services. Customer gives KONE the right to utilize 24/7 Connected Services to collect, export and use data generated by the use and operation of the equipment. Customer will not use the 24/7 Connected Services device, except in connection with the use and operation of the equipment. Customer will not reverse engineer or otherwise attempt to obtain the source code of any software in object code form. Customer has no ownership or proprietary rights to such data, nor the device or software that monitors, analyzes, translates, reports or compiles such data. KONE 24/7 Connected Services, including any data collected, the device(s) to perform the service, and any software related thereto shall be the exclusive property of

KONE.

- 6. If any or all Services are terminated, upon KONE's request the Customer shall give KONE access to the equipment to remove any remote monitoring devices owned by KONE along with any other equipment which remains KONE's property at the facility or otherwise at KONE's expense. Such right shall survive the expiration or termination of the Agreement. Upon termination for any reason of the KONE 24/7 Connected Services, no further data will be collected. Upon any termination or expiration of the Agreement, no further services will be provided, including phone services or data collection. KONE shall have no obligation to any party to either collect, export or analyze any data, or to provide the source code of any software in object code form. Customer shall provide KONE at least 30 day prior notice of intent to terminate or otherwise cancel this agreement.
- 7. Term for this agreement shall be a one-year term with additional one-year options to renew at the same price,
- 8. KONE MAKES NO EXPRESS OR IMPLIED WARRANTY; DISCLAIMS ANY WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE, TITLE OR NON-INFRINGEMENT; AND DISCLAIMS ANY WARRANTIES ARISING BY USAGE OF TRADE OR BY COURSE OF DEALING. KONE MAKES NO WARRANTY THAT SERVICES WILL BE UNINTERRUPTED OR ERROR-FREE. KONE IS NOT LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGES RELATING TO LACK OF NETWORK COVERAGE AT THE SITE OF THE EQUIPMENT, DUE TO TAMPERING WITH THE REMOTE MONITORING DEVICE, INTEROPERABILITY, SERVICE DEFECTS, SERVICE LEVELS, DELAYS, SERVICE ERRORS, INTERRUPTIONS OR ANY OTHER REASON OUTSIDE OF KONE'S REASONABLE CONTROL.
