Auditor's Report

August 2026

SUMMARY:

General Revenue Fund Balance \$7.433 million (\$487,191) restricted to Circuit Court building).

Using the rule of thumb that monthly expenditures should be 1/12th of the annual budget (currently 67%) most offices and departments are within that range.

The fund balance has been corrected based on the closure and reconciliation of the Ozark Bank account. That account has been truly reconciled and all funds transferred to Guaranty Bank.

My office is working with the Treasurer's office on true reconciliation of all other bank accounts – we are cautiously optimistic that most significant issues will be resolved by year end.

Most officials and department heads submitted their 2027 budget requests within 48 hours of the statutory deadline – therefore that will remain this office's priority for the remainder of the year.

AN ORDER, AUTHORIZING PROCEDURES TO ENACT A COUNTY-WIDE BURN BAN PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY OF STATE LAW AND SECTION 49.266 RSMO.

BE IT ORDERED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSION OF CHRISTIAN COUNTY, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the County Commission of Christian County, Missouri, is authorized to enact Orders to promote and enhance the public health, safety and general welfare of individuals within Christian County, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, Section 49.266 RSMo. authorizes the enactment of a County-wide ban of open fires pursuant to the provisions of that Statute; and

WHEREAS, the State Fire Marshall has determined a burn ban order is appropriate for Christian County because the US Drought Monitor has designated Christian County as D-3 being an area of extreme drought pursuant to Section 49.266.3 RSMo.

NOW on this ____ day of August, 2022, upon motion made by Commissioner _____ and Seconded by Commissioner _____ the Christian County Commission unanimously voted to enact as County burn ban for Christian County as follows:

SECTION 1: PURPOSE:

This ordinance is intended to promote the public health, safety and welfare and to safeguard the health, comfort, living conditions, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County of Christian by temporarily regulating the fire hazards of open burning and outdoor burning during the current drought conditions.

SECTION 2: APPLICABILITY

2. Applicability.

This ordinance applies to all outdoor burning and open burning within the unincorporated areas of the county, and all incorporated areas within Christian County that do not have a municipal ordinance banning open burning.

2.1 This ordinance does not apply to grilling or cooking food using charcoal, wood, propane or natural gas in cooking or grilling appliances.

2.2 This ordinance does not apply to burning for the purpose of generating heat in a stove, furnace, fireplace or other heating device within a building used for human or animal habitation.

2.3 This ordinance does not apply to the use of propane, acetylene, natural gas, gasoline or kerosene in a device intended for heating, construction or maintenance activities.

SECTION 3: SEVERABILITY

3. Severability

Should any portion of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected.

SECTION 4: DEFINITIONS

4. Definitions

4.1. “Campfire” means a small outdoor fire intended for recreation or cooking but not including a fire intended for disposal of waste, wood or refuse.

4.2. “Clean wood” means natural wood which has not been painted, varnished or coated with a similar material; has not been pressure treated with preservatives; and does not contain resins or glues as in plywood or other composite.

4.3. “Construction and demolition waste” means building waste material, including but not limited to waste shingles, insulation, lumber, treated wood, painted wood, wiring, plastics, packaging, and rubble that results from construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition operations on a house commercial or industrial building, or other structure.

4.4. “Outdoor burning: means open burning or burning in an outdoor wood-fired boiler or patio wood burning unit.

4.5. “Open burning” means kindling or maintaining a fire where the products of combustion are emitted directly into the ambient air without passing through a stack or chimney. This includes burning in a burn barrel.

4.6. “Outdoor wood-fired boiler” means a wood-fired boiler, stove or furnace that is not located within a building intended for habitation by humans or domestic animals.

4.7. “Patio wood-burning unit” means chimenea, patio warmer, or other portable wood-burning device used for outdoor recreation and/or heating.

4.8. “Refuse” means any waste material including trash, trees, logs brush, stumps, leaves, grass clippings, and other vegetative matter. Refuse shall include controlled burning of vegetative and brush material on real property.

SECTION 5: GENERAL PROHIBITION ON OUTDOOR BURNING AND OPEN BURNING

5. General prohibition on outdoor burning and open burning.

Open burning and outdoor burning are prohibited in the county unless the burning is specifically permitted by this ordinance.

SECTION 6: OPEN BURNING OF REFUSE

6. Open burning of refuse.

6.1. Open burning of refuse from a residential commercial or industrial establishment is prohibited.

6.2. Open burning of the following materials is prohibited.

6.2.1. Construction and demolition waste.

6.2.2. Hazardous substances including but not limited to batteries, household chemicals, pesticides, used oil, gasoline, paints, varnishes, and solvents.

6.2.3. Furniture and appliances.

6.2.4. Tires.

6.2.5. Any plastic materials including but not limited to nylon, PVC, ABS, polystyrene or urethane foam, and plastic containers.

6.2.6. Treated or painted wood including but not limited to plywood, composite wood products or other wood products that are painted, varnished or treated with preservatives.

SECTION 7: OPEN BURNING OF TREES, LOGS, BRUSH, STUMPS, LEAVES, AND GRASS CLIPPINGS

7. Open burning of refuse, vegetative materials, leaves, limbs and wood.

7.1. Except for barbecue, gas, and charcoal grills, no burning shall be undertaken within 50 feet from any combustible material.

SECTION 8: AGRICULTURAL BURNING

8. Agricultural Burning.

8.1. Open burning of refuse, weeds, brush, fence rows, and crop stubble on agricultural lands is prohibited.

SECTION 9: LIABILITY, ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

9. Liability.

9.1. A person utilizing or maintaining an outdoor fire shall be responsible for all fire suppression costs and any other liability resulting from damage caused by the fire. A person found to have violated this ordinance shall be guilty of a Class A Misdemeanor and subject to a range of punishment of up to 365 days in jail and a fine of up to \$2,000.00 or any combination thereof.

SECTION 10; EFFECTIVE DATE AND SUNSET

10. This Ordinance was approved and adopted by the County of Christian at a regular meeting held on August __, 2022. This Ordinance shall be posted on the County Courthouse and shall be effective on the date of execution. This ordinance shall sunset 30 days after the date of adoption, unless terminated or extended an earlier time by the Christian County Commission.

SECTION 9: BURNING PERMITS

9. Specific prohibitions detailed within this Order may only be waived if an individual obtains a Burning Permit authorized and issued by the Fire Chief or designated official of the appropriate fire station, with respect to the proposed location of the burn site. Issuance of such permits is at the discretion of the fire department.

SECTION 10: LIABILITY, ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

10. Liability.

10.1. A person utilizing or maintaining an outdoor fire shall be responsible for all fire suppression costs and any other liability resulting from damage caused by the fire. A person found to have violated this ordinance shall be guilty of a Class A Misdemeanor and subject to a range of punishment of up to 365 days in jail and a fine of up to \$2,000.00 or any combination thereof.

SECTION 11; EFFECTIVE DATE AND SUNSET

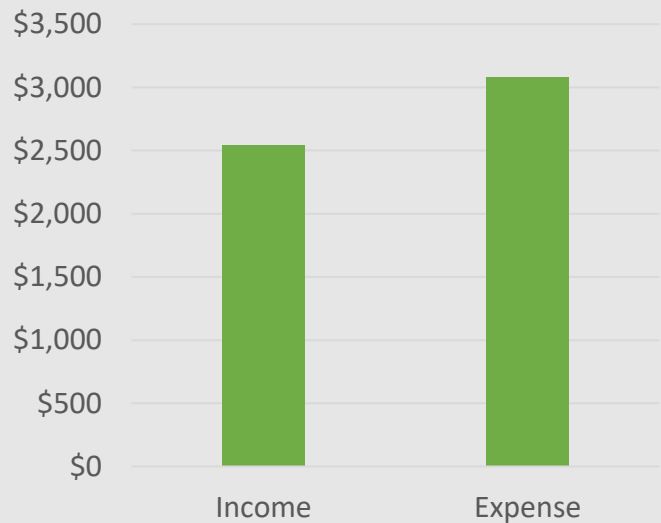


Christian County SWCD Funding

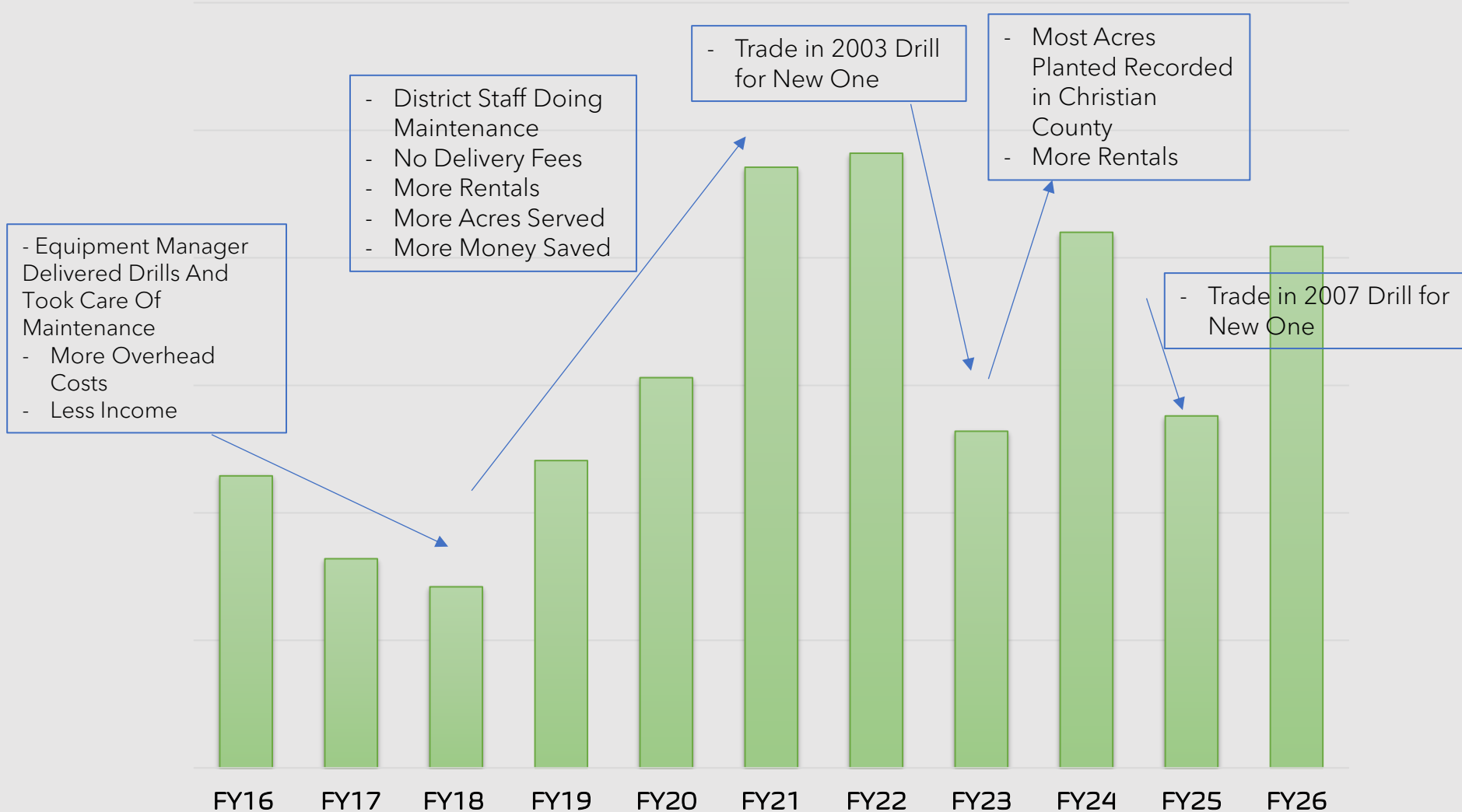

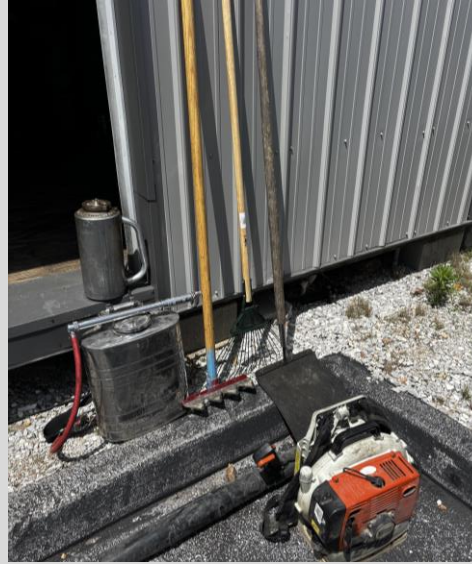
